



The evidence is intriguing but fragmentary, including literary and iconographic sources and, most importantly, the financial records of royal and aristocratic households and of towns. These offer many insights, although they are often hard to fit into any coherent picture of the minstrels' lives and their place in society. Rastall and Taylor bring to bear the available evidence to enlarge and enrich our view of the minstrel in late medieval society.
