

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



When Gordon arrived in Japan, he expected ruthless samurai, angry Japanese men ready to kill Australians at every corner. Instead, he found Cherry, terrified of ex-enemy soldiers, a 16-year-old survivor of the atomic bomb. Against all the rules and against all odds, they fall in love. But when Gordon discovers the White Australia Policy prevents Cherry coming home with him as his war bride, Gordon does what any 20-year-old soldier would do. He vows to fight. 
OVER THE HILL AND UP THE WALL

Of course, we love our parents. Even if they do so many things that drive us bonkers.

Like how a mother – for argument's sake, let's say mine – taps her fingernails on the car window whenever she sees a place of interest (seven taps for a regular haunt, up to twenty for somewhere fascinating). 

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

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

It went on to become the most successful independent movie ever, earning him a Golden Globe Award for Best Actor in a Comedy and an Academy Award nomination for Best Original Screenplay, and making him a household name worldwide. Following the success of *Crocodile Dundee*, Hogan hosted the Academy Awards and starred in several other films, including *Crocodile Dundee II*, *Almost an Angel, Lightning Jack, Charlie & Boots* and *The Very Excellent Mr Dundee*.

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

As a cop, I used to sit on one side of the interview room table facing murderers, child abductors and rapists. Now I'm sitting on the other side: disgraced, forced out of the police and judged to be a criminal. I want to show you what the world looks like from here.

Talking to crooks, cops, forensic psychologists, scientists and victims, I've gone back to some of Australia's worst acts of badness, including unsolved murders that never made the front pages as well as infamous killings carried out by Ivan Milat and the Granny Killer, the murder of Anita Cobby, the Hoddle Street massacre, Port Arthur, horrific abuse at the Parramatta girls' home and the disappearance of preschooler William Tyrrell.

What I've found has made me question everything, including where evil comes from, what drives us to commit crimes and how we can prevent them. I used to think I was on the side of the angels. Now I am not so sure.

CARL HAYMAN AND DYLAN CLEAVER

Carl Hayman, All Black #1000, once the most highly prized player in world rugby and a giant of the game in every sense – someone who was always respected, even feared. But at the end of seventeen years as a professional rugby player, the last eight played with the sole aim of setting up his family's future, Hayman's life began to unravel in nightmarish fashion.

Head On is about the pressures on the modern athlete, where physical performance and commerce collide, and players become victims of their own success.

Exploited then left out in the cold, Hayman is now left counting the hidden cost of the achievements that would have exceeded any young rugby player's wildest dreams. He now fears both the known and the unknown with equal trepidation as he looks for answers to dementia and a degenerative brain condition called CTE (chronic traumatic encephalopathy). Experimental treatments, family, hope, and the enduring power of the human spirit have become Carl's go-tos. As a relatively young man, still in his early 40s, Hayman contends with brain degeneration he should only be seeing at the end of his life, not in his prime.

In *Head On*, Hayman relives a remarkable rugby career, with revelations about the shock All Blacks loss to France in the 2007 Rugby World Cup, the decisions to leave New Zealand and play for the Newcastle Falcons in England, in doing so becoming one of the best-paid players on the planet, and how being put on the fast track to the All Blacks as a youngster combined with the Southern Man rugby ethos in Dunedin caused him to develop a dangerous relationship with alcohol.

This book is about the testosterone-fueled, play-hard, drink-hard mentality of rugby, where playing with pain was not just accepted, but expected. If it took an unhealthy cocktail of painkillers and alcohol to get through to another match day, that's what you did. But this book is also about how all of us can better understand how the decisions we make can have unintended consequences, and how we can better serve our young sporting talent.

Dylan Cleaver has spent the better part of three decades covering sport. Now the publisher of sports newsletter The Bounce, Cleaver has worked for mastheads such as the New Zealand Herald, Herald on Sunday, Sunday Star-Times, Sunday News and Irish Examiner, as well as contributing regularly to websites The Spinoff, Cricket Monthly and CODE Sports. Cleaver has won close to 40 national journalism awards, including Best Investigation at the Canon Media Awards in 2015 for his work on match-fixing allegations involving former New Zealand cricketers. He has been named Sports Journalist of the Year on multiple occasions, including 2022, where he was recognised in part for a feature article on Carl Hayman, and in 2017 for his groundbreaking work linking the high rates of dementia in former rugby players with head injuries suffered in their playing days.

After sailing to Tahiti with William Bligh, Flinders was drawn to adventure, and by 1801 he was in command of an expedition to uncover the true nature of the great continent of the southern ocean.

Vivian Bullwinkel was twenty-seven when a Japanese execution squad marched her and 22 other army nurses into shallow waters on a remote beach near Sumatra.

Some of the women next to her in the doomed line began reciting the Lord's Prayer or calling out the names of people they loved for the final time. Then the machine gun roared out, and amid the cries of her colleagues, Vivian felt a bullet slam into her back and tear through her grey nurses uniform. She fell face forward into salty water that was already becoming red from the blood of her dear friends.

As Vivian waited to die she could hear Japanese soldiers bayoneting some of her friends who still showed signs of life.

Vivian lay perfectly still in the water and to her overwhelming relief soon heard the soldiers marching away from the beach.

Somehow, badly wounded as she was, Vivian was the lone survivor of the massacre.

With her own life spared, she spent the rest of her long life saving others.

Vivian eventually became an inmate at a Japanese prisoner of war camp and spent three years helping other prisoners get through their living hell.

In 2023, the late Lieutenant Colonel Vivian Bullwinkel became the first woman to be honoured with a statue at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra, a statue that pays tribute to the extraordinary bravery, courage and love for humanity of an Australian country girl who had devoted her long life to helping other people.

Until September 2014, he was a principal of Aadi Defence Pty Ltd, facilitating access for Australian industry to defence technology grants and working with other high technology industries. He was a consultant to Deakin University, BAE Systems Australia and Israeli Aerospace Industries. Jim was active in speaking out on defence issues, in particular, on Australia's preparedness against an aggressive China.


