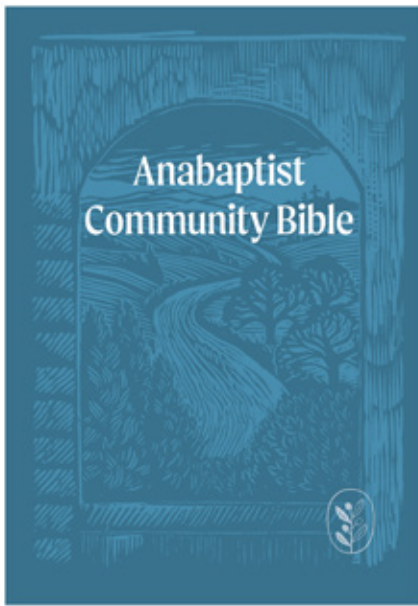

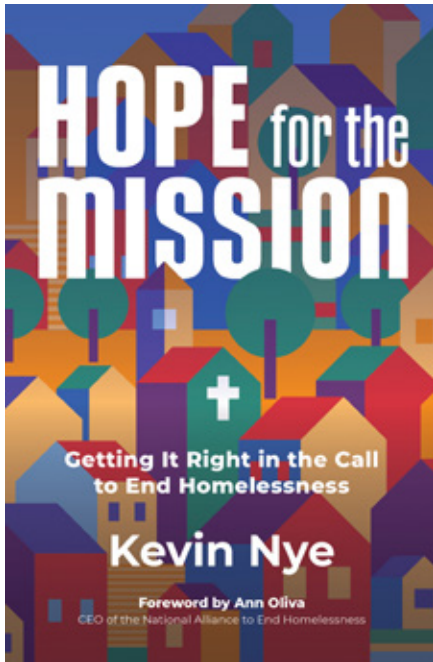

To end homelessness, we don't have to choose between faith and facts.

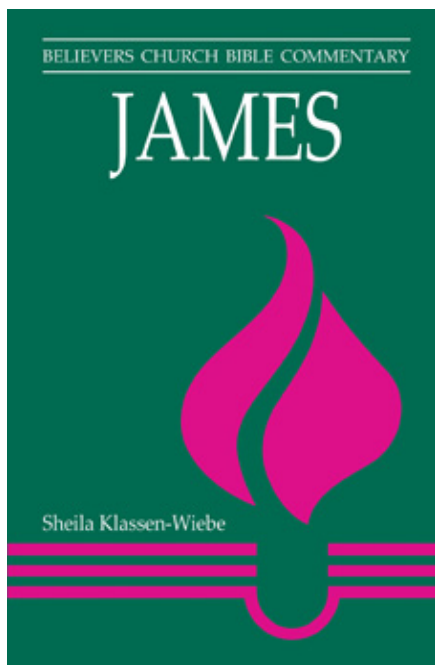
For well over a century, Christian ministries have actively offered relief for the poor and unhoused in North America. The dominant model in faith-based homelessness response has long been gospel rescue missions, nonprofit organizations that shelter and feed people experiencing homelessness. While the presence of these ministries in this work is undeniable, they often position themselves *against* best practices to meet their goal of evangelism. This approach often perpetuates homelessness instead of ending it.

In this inspiring and clarifying book, homeless services advocate Kevin Nye reports on dozens of faith-based stories and examples that will equip readers to help end homelessness in their communities. Alongside critical evaluation of what Christian groups have tended to get wrong in addressing homelessness, Nye offers stories of faith and hope about what's going right. Churches and other organizations have been faithfully answering the call to provide services, support, shelter, housing, and so much more in ways that align with broader efforts to successfully end homelessness. These exemplars embody the spirit of Christian social response alongside a commitment to the most effective, evidence-based practices for ending homelessness.

Hope for the Mission offers groups of any size paths to consider, values to emulate, and methods to embody as we follow Jesus toward solidarity with the unhoused. Believers Church Bible Commentary

Sheila Klassen-Wiebe

The letter of James has a clear and compelling message: faith in Jesus Christ must make a difference in how we live. James calls individual believers and the church to live with integrity, to be “whole” people and not “double-minded.” What we believe and know must be reflected in what we say and do. Although intensely practical, the letter is not merely a checklist of rules to follow to be “good people.” Rather, it is profoundly rooted in a theology of God’s grace, goodness, and generosity and in the good news that God has birthed us by the word of truth, making us new creatures.

Although the letter of James mentions Jesus infrequently, it is thoroughly soaked in the teachings of Jesus, particularly the Sermon on the Mount. At the heart of those teachings is the admonition to “love your neighbor as yourself.” For James, such love is demonstrated in speaking truthfully and kindly, caring for the vulnerable, sharing generously with those in need, not privileging those with status and money, praying for and forgiving each other, and being patient in times of trial—to name only a few.

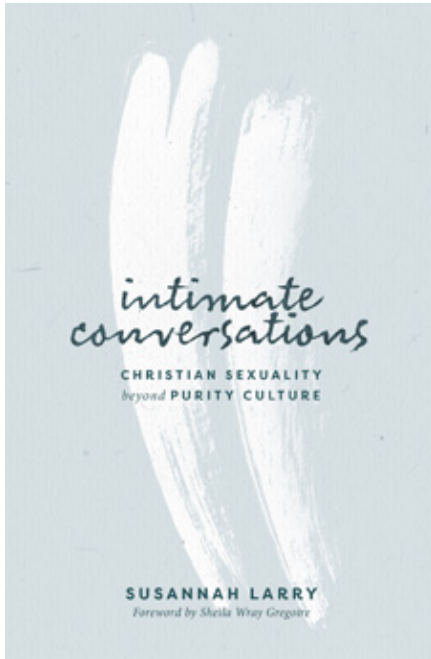
The 38th volume in the Believers Church Bible Commentary series works at interpreting the letter of James with a view to how its original Jewish Christian readers would have heard it and how it continues to have resonance today. Scholar Sheila Klassen-Wiebe is attentive both to detailed exegetical issues and to how teachings fit into the larger context of the letter and the biblical story. Although the letter is sometimes perceived as disjointed bits of advice, this commentary argues that James has a coherent message intended to prod the church toward greater faithfulness and to encourage people to follow Jesus in all of life.

Christian Sexuality beyond Purity Culture

The Bible can help us have better conversations about sex.

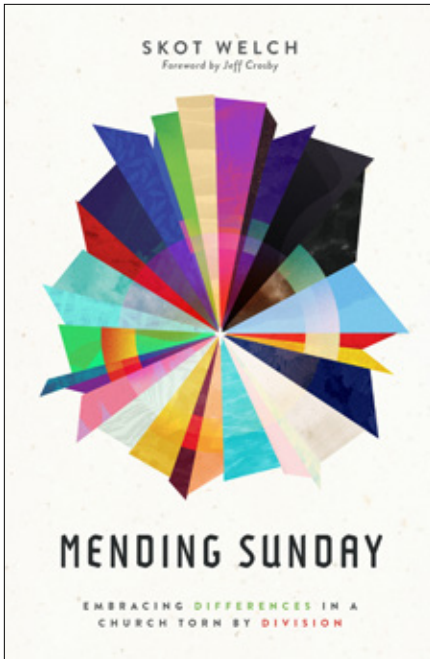
For many of us, formation around sexuality was often marked by a lack of information and honest dialogue. The teaching we did receive was confusing at times, especially since secular and religious ideas about sexuality often seemed at odds.

These concerns are especially acute for parents seeking to share healthy, faithful ideas about sexuality with their children. We know that abstinence-only sex education doesn't stop risky behavior among teens and that purity culture leaves harmful legacies. Messages from outside church walls seem to offer the simplest and safest way out of the conundrum—yet we also want our faith to sit right with our counsel on many issues, including sexuality. If we don't endorse purity culture, yet we still believe faith holds a role in sexuality, what might the Bible and Christian theology actually have to say to us today?

Though the Bible is often quite vague on the whos, whens, wheres, and whats of sexuality, it *does* offer a beautiful image of the why: to know and share the love of God, poured out on us from creation. In *Intimate Conversations*, scholar Susannah Larry offers a whole-bodied vision for sexuality that is empowering, faithful, and life-giving as she explores what ideas to pass on to her children about Christian sexuality. Rather than a rulebook or an encyclopedia, the Bible tells us a story of God's desire for justice, reconciliation, and joy for all people—including our sexuality. God longs for all humanity to experience wholeness. Grounded in Scripture and celebrating the goodness of human sexuality, *Intimate Conversations* will help adults reclaim the Bible as a resource for telling a joyful and holistic story about sexuality.

Embracing Differences in a Church Torn by Division

God compels us to unity amid difference.

We tend to demand uniformity, but our heavenly Father commands unity. There is no miracle of unity when everybody in the room is already alike in almost every way possible. Unity is expressed only when things come together that were once separated because of difference—when people from every group, nation, and tongue praise the name of Jesus.

Yet even today, Christians remain some of the most divided people on the planet. We call each other names and split along political lines, denominational lines, and other fissures we imagine and create. Most of us would rather go to church with, be friends with, break bread with, live in neighborhoods with, and spend time with other Christians who are most “like” themselves. Our segregated habits may satisfy our need for comfort, but division breaks God’s heart.

In *Mending Sunday*, author Skot Welch lays out a pathway for putting on the mind of Christ when it comes to diversity and division. God’s unity doesn’t mean giving up our unique identities as expressed through ethnicity, race, or other aspects of self and culture. Rather, when we put Jesus at the center of ourselves and our communities, we will experience a grace and power we’ve never known before. When worldly culture seeks to divide, a church that embraces its differences will be the biggest witness of Christ the world has ever seen.

And religious wrongdoing is more than what might feel like long-ago history. Many today have suffered church-related trauma themselves or have loved ones hurt by fellow believers. Some of us have distanced ourselves from the church as a result. Others who have remained, perhaps reluctantly, may feel a certain low-grade sickness from constant disappointment with religious people and institutions. Does admitting this make us bad Christians?

As someone who has spent 40 years working for a Christian organization and attending the same local church, author Scott A. Bessenecker has faced plenty of disappointment with the church—yet has found a richer spirituality by acknowledging the harms done by people who profess to follow Jesus. Pursuing Peace in a Militarized World

Ben Daniel

We need to talk about the reality of war.

War remains a clear and present evil, yet North American Christians often don't feel equipped to talk about it. When a US Air Force drone drops a bomb on a wedding party in Yemen, for example, few of us have the language to talk about that violence. When our military invades a territory or when we fight proxy wars through other countries, our response to military violence tends to follow our political beliefs rather than our religious convictions.

Our allegiance to military might goes beyond ongoing global conflicts. The United States boasts a bloated military budget, which includes displays of patriotism at sporting events and military recruitment directed at children in public schools. As nationalism and warfare trend around the globe, people seeking peace are compelled to question the mania for militarism and violence.

Grace over Guns challenges readers to think through common justifications for military violence and to consider how those justifications might not measure up to the teachings of Jesus. Drawing on story and Scripture, pastor Ben Daniel offers a prophetic call to reject the sin of military violence and embrace the grace of Christian pacifism.

So, too, have many women across the pages of the Bible. In their stories of doubt and questioning, of dryness and distance, we can find guideposts for the inevitable wilderness periods in our own lives. As we enter into the wilderness season of the church year, this Lenten devotional by Joanna Harader explores the stories of 30 biblical women—from Eve to Mary Magdalene—who had their own such experiences. Some inhabited a literal wilderness, whereas for others the wilderness was metaphorical. All were drawn closer to God, who does not leave us to wander alone.

Michael Adam Beck is the director of the Fresh Expressions House of Studies at United Theological Seminary, director of Fresh Expressions Florida, and director of Fresh Expressions for

the United Methodist Church. He serves as the co-pastor of Wildwood UMC, St. Marks UMC, and Compassion UMC with his wife Jill, where they direct addiction recovery programs, a jail ministry, a food pantry, and an interracial unity movement and house a faith-based inpatient treatment center. Wildwood and St. Marks are traditional congregations *and* a network of 13 “fresh expressions” that gather in tattoo parlors, dog parks, salons, running tracks, community centers, burrito joints, and digital spaces.

Never Alone

Sharing the Gift of Community in a Lonely World

We have never been more connected—yet we have never felt more alone.

Disability Justice and the Community of Christ
(A Lenten Devotional)

Encounter God's love at the borders of our bodies.

During Lent, we often reflect on our limits—from dust we are, and to dust we will return. We remember that we will never be able to do everything we want to do, even and especially when what we want to do is love our neighbor well. In this daily devotional, Disability rights activist Tatum Tricarico helps us turn the tables on Lent. Rather than a time of feeling condemned or guilty beyond help, Lent is when we can take a breath and finally say what we have been trying to hide all year: I am human. I can't do it all. And still, I am beloved by God.

Disabled people have always known that our bodies and actions don't fit into boxes marked "perfect" or "endless." Every day, they encounter ableist, discriminatory practices that spell out the limits of bodies, minds, and human connection. In far more than forty days, Disabled people have learned to be honest about their bodies, to love them and name them as good, not despite finitude, but because of it.
