## The Technologist Issue *Journal for the Study of Radicalism* 20, no. 2 (Fall 2026)

Finally, we invite research centered on specific technologists like Elon Musk, Peter Thiel, Marc Andreessen, Joe Lonsdale, Alex Karp, Palmer Luckey, and others. Historically focused explorations are welcome; indeed, we are interested in a wide range of approaches and methodologies. As ever, beyond this call, we invite work on other topics concerning radical groups or individuals across the political spectrum.
