CALL FOR PAPERS





The West Indian Law Journal is published by the Council of Legal Education at the Norman Manley Law School. The articles presented reflect pertinent, educational and contemporary information on legal issues and are subject to blind peer review. These articles are especially useful to legal practitioners, students and researchers. We are currently inviting prospective contributors to submit innovative, original and thought-provoking work in the different areas of the law.

Please read the following instructions carefully before proceeding to submit an article.

NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

1. Content.

The journal is directed primarily to Lawyers in the Commonwealth Caribbean, but articles relating to general (non-regional) legal problems, international and comparative law, international relations and Caribbean socio-political issues may also be considered.

2. Articles

Should be typed in English, Arial 12 characters per inch, double spaced on one side of the paper only. One inch margins should be left at the top, bottom, left and right sides of the paper, pages should be numbered serially. Authors should submit at least two copies, one, the top copy thoroughly revised. The title of the article, the author's name and a biographical note on him/her should be typed on the flysheet. The article must have an abstract with key words.

3. Footnotes:

Footnotes should be numbered consecutively and should be typed double spaced 10 characters per inch at the foot of the paper.

4. Length:

- Articles should not exceed 10,000 words and case notes and book reviews should not exceed 1,500 words. The Editor may agree to split larger articles between different issues.
- The final product will be limited to a maximum of ten (10) articles of ten thousand (10,000) words each or a maximum of one hundred thousand (100,000) words in total for all articles combined per issue, except for Volume 41 (1) for which the call for articles shall not exceed 104,000.00.
- The Editorial Board reserves its copyright in the typographical arrangement of the Journal.

5. Book Review:

A book review heading should appear as follows: Title, author, publisher, place, date, also pagination and price if available.

6. <u>Originality</u> The contribution must be the author's original work and should not have been offered for general publication elsewhere. Conference papers not otherwise published will be considered for publication.

7. Copyright:

The copyright will be registered in the name of the Council of Legal Education by the Publisher in accordance with the applicable Copyright Legislation.

8. Copies

The Journal will provide one free hard copy to the contributor of the issue in which the article appears. Additional copies may be purchased from the Publisher.

9. Style & Reference:

Authors shall as far as possible follow the principles of citation and style recommended by **Oxford Standard for the Citation of Legal Authorities** published by the Oxford University.
